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

THIS CAN CHANGE!



The time for **reconciliation** with Indigenous people is now. One piece of that is reconciliation between peoples at either ends of Manitoba's north-south power lines. **We propose to start by:** 



7 Rates

MB Hydro predicts rate increases of 3.95% annually for the next 15 years.

### We Propose

A flat 15% hydro bill subsidy **and** rate freeze for hydro-affected communities starting in 2016. This will result in an annual savings of up to \$1,361 by 2024 (see bar graph). Some northern MB Hydro workers get subsidized heating; hydro-affected peoples deserve a break too.

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## **Efficiency**

Northern hydro bills are high largely because of substandard housing and cold temperatures.

## **We Propose**

An aggressive northern roll-out of MB Hydro's Power Smart program for First Nations, making homes more efficient.
